Amelia by Graff

Davide Oppizzi's sharklike tap comes with a low-flow aerator and features a joystick lever. The high-end version comes with an RGB LED temperature indicator. Available in chrome, white and black. #8991, \$2,350 with LED; grafffaucets.com

Asta by CEA

Talk about a tap with personality. This stainless steel fixture, with its silicone hose, pours five litres per minute, compared to a standard tap's 8.3 litres a minute. From #1245, ceadesign.it

Alteo Centre-Set Lavatory by Kohler

This timeless design in polished chrome incorporates a low-flow aerator, which earned it an EPA WaterSense label. #150, kohler.com

Axor Stark Organic

The female body's natural curves inspired Philippe Starck's minimalist faucet. For a lighter rise, just twist the nozzle to switch from five litres per minute to a super-efficient 3.4 litres per minute. From \$575, axor.com

Balocchi by Fantini

The 2013 sales from the socially conscious faucet help Fantini build fourth Messago, Burundi, where the company is also constructing an aqueduct line to improve access to clean water. The fixture comes in a variety of colours, including red, yellow and apple green. #930, fantini.it

Alure Brilliant by Grohe

This sleek, angular faucet - with an "aqua window" that frames the cascade - delivers a modest 5.7 litres per minute, saving almost three litres from each good hand scrubbing. #735, grohe.co
